

1 Call "911" if anyone needs medical attention.

Check to see if you or any passengers with you were injured in the automobile accident.

2 Safely get out of the way of traffic.

If your car does not work, turn on your warning lights.

3 Call the police so the accident is properly documented (hopefully with witnesses).

4 Obtain information from the other driver involved in the car accident, including:

7 Take pictures of everything involved in the car accident, as long as it can be done safely.

Pictures of:

- Each person/bodily injuries
- Damage to cars and/or property
- Skid marks
- Location of the accident

The more pictures/videos the better.

8 Schedule an appointment with your doctor.

Many people who are injured don't realize it right away. It is wise to see your doctor to make sure that you are okay.
